Tufts Public Health students graduate with the skills and knowledge they need to tackle diverse public health challenges. Multiple concentrations, dual degrees, and field of studies enable students to create a course of study that is tailored to their professional interests and strengths. Through classroom discussions and assignments, students gain an understanding of research methods, critical thinking skills, and the capacity to collaborate with a multidisciplinary group of practitioners, government officials, academic professionals, and community members.

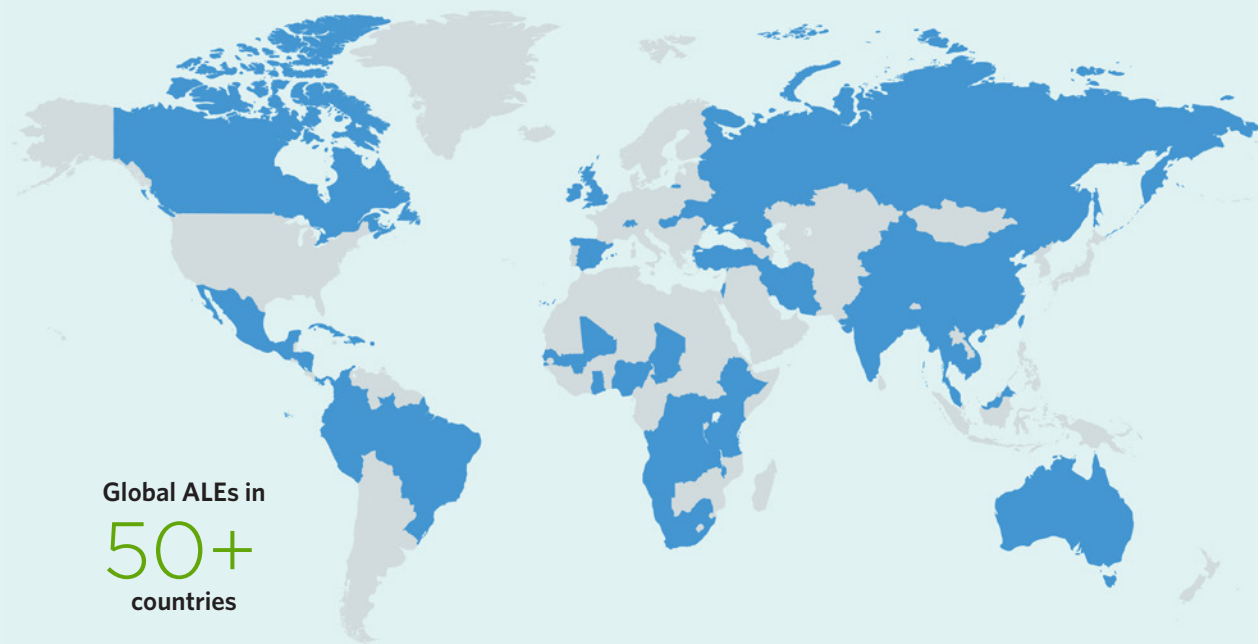
Putting Education into Action

Applied Learning Experience

Tufts Public Health does more than arm students with theoretical knowledge, it provides practical skills and training that will transform graduates into the next generation of public health leaders. Hands-on field work is woven throughout the curriculum, and our unique Applied Learning Experience (ALE) provides students with experience designing and implementing a public health project. Working with a preceptor at an outside agency, the ALE gives students the opportunity to apply what they have learned in the classroom to a real-world public health challenge—all while gaining practical experience and professional connections that prepare them for career success.

Global Health Focus

For students with a keen interest in global public health experiences, and those who may find themselves working for organizations with a global reach, the Tufts Master of Public Health (MPH) program offers the Global Health Focus, an optional choice open to students in any MPH concentration electives. Students work with faculty to identify electives that have a global health dimension and fall within their concentration's scope. Faculty also assist in identifying possible organizations or sites that would provide an appropriate ALE that is globally focused.



A Network of Support, Now and Throughout Your Career

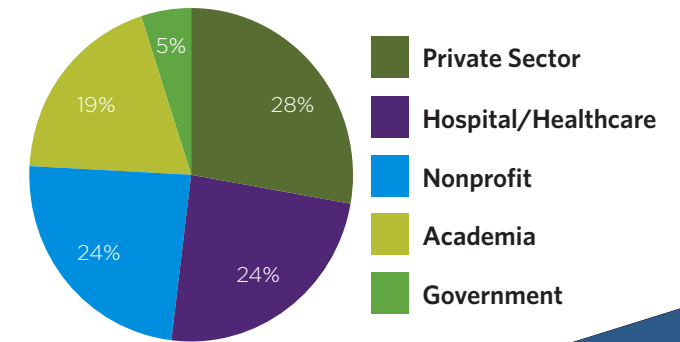
