Questions you may be asked in an interview:

- 1. What makes you think this is the right school for you?
- 2. Why are you interested in this particular institution?
- 3. What academic areas are you interested in exploring?
- 4. What do you expect to be doing ten years from now?
- 5. What have you liked and disliked about your high school?
- 6. What is the last book you read?
- 7. What part of yourself would you most like to improve over the next four years?
- 8. What magazines/newspapers do you read regularly?
- 9. What are your most important extra-curricular activities?
- 10. Describe your strengths; discuss your weaknesses.
- 11. How would your best friend describe you?
- 12. What do you hope to get out of your college experience?
- 13. What will you bring to our community?

Questions you may want to ask during the interview:

- 1. What is distinctive about the college?
- 2. Can you elaborate on academic programs that fit my interests?
- 3. Will I have easy access to computers?
- 4. What are the strengths and weaknesses of the college's advising system?
- 5. Will I have access to special equipment as a first-year student?
- 6. What type of campus employment is there if I don't qualify for work study?
- 7. Are there new programs or facilities that will be available in the next couple of years?
- 8. What are the college's most recent graduates doing now?
- 9. Is the college "need blind" in its admission policies?
- 10. How many students in the freshman class returned for their sophomore year?
- 11. What types of academic support services are available at no additional cost (i.e. tutoring, counseling, etc.)?
- 12. What do students do when they aren't studying?
- 13. How would you describe a student who is a good fit for your institution?
- 14. Do you have special interest residence halls?
