The Division of Pharmacoepidemiology and Pharmacoeconomics at Brigham and Women's Hospital (BWH) and Harvard Medical School (HMS) invites **rising college senior students who self identify as Black/African-American, Hispanic/Latinx, Native American/Alaskan Native or Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander** to participate in an eight-week summer internship program that provides training and skills development in public health research about prescription medications. US Citizens & Permanent Residents and International students who are matriculated at U.S. colleges/Universities may apply.

ABOUT THE DIVISION

The Division of Pharmacoepidemiology and Pharmacoeconomics (DoPE) brings together researchers with expertise in medicine, epidemiology, biostatistics, health services research, economics, legal, regulatory and the social sciences to evaluate the effectiveness of prescription drugs in relation to their risks and costs, examine patterns in physician prescribing patient drug utilization, and understand how medicines are approved and regulated after their marketing.

The summer internship provides the opportunity for experiential and didactic learning through division meetings, journal clubs, webinars, and guest presentations. Interns complete a summer capstone research project under the supervision of a faculty member. Interns also have the opportunity to audit summer courses offered by faculty at Harvard T.H Chan School of Public Health and in other Harvard venues.
