INTERNSHIPS & CO-OPS

The Massachusetts Life Sciences Center (MLSC) Internship Challenge funds hundreds of internships each year for college students interested in pursuing careers in the life sciences. The program connects employers with students through an online platform and provides funding to enable eligible organizations to hire paid interns. Offered year-round, this workforce development program seeks to enhance and build a robust talent pipeline for Massachusetts life science companies, research institutions, incubators, and trade associations. Centers for Disease Control & Prevention (CDC) The Internship Program is for high school and college students in search of an internship or other opportunity to gain work experience while in school. The program is designed to provide students who are enrolled in a wide variety of educational institutions, from high school to graduate level, with paid opportunities to work in agencies and explore Federal careers while still in school. Vertex Fellows Program - The goal of the highly competitive Vertex Fellows Program is to provide a unique development opportunity for outstanding early career scientists to learn about the industry. This one-year exploratory industrial post-doc program is designed to augment a traditional academic post-doc. Fellows will join starting in September 2024 at one of our Research sites in Boston, San Diego, and Oxford. They will work within our research teams, receive mentorship from senior leaders and learn about the science and business of drug discovery and development through an intentionally designed learning curriculum.
