The National Center for Biotechnology Information (NCBI) at the National Library of Medicine (NLM), National Institutes of Health (NIH) performs research on computational biology and creates and maintains information systems and computational tools for the biological research community. The NCBI is seeking a Program Head to manage the ClinicalTrials.gov project, a critical, highly visible, informational NIH resource, provides leadership and technical and scientific direction in support of the transparency and disclosure of clinical research studies and their results. The Kohlgruber Lab investigates the immune-specific basis of human diseases and applies high-throughput molecular, genetic, and immunological assays to decipher immune system specificities and interactions. We combine human and mouse immunology, with single-cell transcriptomics, synthetic biology, and immune-receptor specificity screening approaches to understand the molecular underpinnings of autoimmunity, cancer, and infectious disease. Our work lies at the intersection of translational immunology and biotechnology, where we seek to pioneer innovative strategies to improve our ability to interrogate and modulate the immune system and leverage our findings toward the development of precision vaccines and immunotherapeutics.
